PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE



Hello Everyone, Can you believe it's already September. We have accomplished a lot in the past nine months and I want to thank our Maintenance and Custodial staff for all that they do to keep our buildings and common areas in such wonderful condition.

REMINDER: If you decide to add someone (family, friend, etc.) to your condominium deed, or if you decide to put your unit in a Trust or if you use a Quit Claim to deed your property to someone, the Sea Towers administrative office needs to know.

Your condominium's governing documents state that all unit sales or transfers must be approved by your association. Therefore, if you are considering making changes to the ownership of your condominium please give the Sea Towers office a call and we will advise you on the proper procedure.

<u>GUESTS, SPECIAL ENTRY, AND UNIT ALTERA-</u> TION FORMS

(The following forms are available at the Sea Towers administrative office)

The Non-Paying Guests Registration form is used when you are not receiving compensation for guests or family staying in your unit while you are away from Sea Towers. This form once approved is good for two (2) weeks.

The Application for Special Entry form is to be used if you will have someone checking on your unit while you are away or if you require a <u>licensed</u> health care person, or maid service. This form, once approved, is good for three (3) months and must be renewed quarterly.

The Unit Alteration form is for anytime you are planning to do any remodeling or upgrading in your condominium unit. Some work and repairs require permits from the County and the use of licensed professionals. The Unit Alteration form must be approved prior to the start of any in-unit project. Failure to submit the Unit Alteration form may lead to your contractor being denied entry or being asked to leave the property.

<u>Please</u>, always use licensed professionals to perform any work in your home, remember anything that you do in your unit may have effects on your neighbors unit if not done properly. If you do not acquire the proper permits or if you use a non-licensed repair person, you could be held liable for any damages and most likely, you will not be covered by your insurance for negligence.

If you have any questions concerning these forms, please feel free to contact the Sea Towers office during our normal hours of operation.







The latest project around here was all the palm trees have been trimmed and they look great. So far the weather has been OK and the rains have been helping with the growth of all the trees and plants. It looks great.



We, at Heritage, have had many of these men and women live among us. One is Bob Frederick. Bob Frederick and Annette Rocca have been our neighbors and friends for a number of years. We would like to dedicate September Heroes month to Bob.

Bob served with the U.S. Navy in WW II. He was aboard the U.S.S. Oakland (CLCLAA-95) when it made its maiden voyage in 1943. Since August 1972, he and Annette have attended the reunions of the men who served abourd this ship. In May of this year, they went to Fredericksburg, Texas, for the dedication and plaque presentation on the 70th anniversary of the commissioning of the U.S.S. Oakland. Members of the "Flying O," as she is called met at The National Museum of the Pacific War.

Bob and the crew had missions from Mare Island, California to Tokyo Bay. The ship, as well as the men, earned 12 Battle Stars and 9 Service Medals. They were in the Asiatic-Pacific Raids, and involved on the Gilbert Is., Marshall, Kwajalein, Majuro, Bismark, Hollandia, W. New Guinea, Mariana Is., W. Caroline Is., Leyte, Luzon, Okinawa and 3rd Fleet Operations.

However, one of their most impressive journeys came on August 30, 1945, when they anchored close to the U.S.S. Missouri and witnessed the signing of the Japanese surrender to the United States.

We thank Bob and all military personnel for their dedication to America in its time of toil and we all hope that Bob and Annette continue to go to all future reunions of the U.S.S. Oakland. Please think about our military forces often, not only in September.

CHEMICALS: Automotive fluids, batteries (household or vehicle), cleaners, cooking oil, fertilizers, fluorescent bulbs and other mercury containing devices, fuels (i.e. gasoline, kerosene), fungicides, herbicides, insecticides, motor oil, paint (latex or oil), paint remover, paint thinner, pesticides, pool chemicals, smoke detectors, solvents, wood preservatives.

ELECTRONICS: Camcorders, CD players, cell phones or smartphones, computers and/ or peripherals, copiers, digital cameras, DVD players, fax machines, GPS units, marine depth finders, microwave ovens, pagers, portable players (*i.e. MP3, iPod*), printer or toner cartridges, radios, stereo equipment, telephones, TVs, VCRs, video game players.

What NOT to bring

A/C units, appliances, biological or infectious waste, empty paint cans, explosives, fire extinguishers, garbage, gas cyclinders larger than one pound (i.e. propane tanks), medicine, radioactive waste, tires.



How to package & transport chemicals:

- (1) Do NOT mix chemicals together.
- (2) Keep products in original labeled containers if possible.
- (3) Place containers into cardboard boxes. Use crumpled newspaper in boxes to prevent breakage.
- (4) Place leaky containers in CLEAR plastic bags, and transport in boxes with newspaper.
- (5) Put boxes in the trunk or in back of vehicle away from passengers.
- (6) Place individual batteries in separate plastic bags, or cover terminals with heavy tape to prevent short-circuits.





Unlicensed Activity is against the law and can cause physical and financial harm. Check to make sure that those who you hire to work on your home hold the proper license(s). Plumbing, AC and roofing are just a few of the services that require a license. Often times unlicensed contractors and scammers prey on Senior citizens. Be a SAVVY SENIOR! Verify Licenses. Hire Licensed Professionals.

Dangers of Hiring an Unlicensed Person

- **Poor qualifications**. Unlicensed persons typically do not have the education, insurance, or qualification required of a licensee.
- **Poor quality work**. Unlicensed contractors typically do poor quality work or do not finish the project, leaving the homeowner to spend more money hiring another contractor to repair or finish the project.
- **Possible criminal background.** Unlicensed persons often have criminal backgrounds that may include fraud, theft, violent crime, sexual offenses, and substance abuse.
- Likelihood of being the victim of a scam. Unlicensed persons often disappear after taking your money, leaving you with very few options to help you get your money back or your work completed. Scams in the construction industry, especially home improvement, sadly are, widespread. Con artists pose as contractors and often target vulnerable people and take advantage of homeowners.
- Limited resources for broken contracts. When you have a dispute with a licensed contractor, you
 call the Department, which has the authority to discipline and even revoke the license. This gives the
 licensee more incentive to play fair. However, this type of action is not available against unlicensed
 contractors and homeowners often find the only answer is an expensive, and generally futile, civil
 suit.
- No insurance and liability for injuries to others: An unlicensed contractor typically is uninsured and will have no way to pay you back for any property damage. You may end up being liable for personal or financial injuries to others.
- No coverage under homeowner's policy. Most homeowner policies require that work must be done by a licensed contractor and provide no coverage for work that is not.


Noncompliance with building codes. Most projects, even small ones, require permits and inspections that unlicensed contractors ignore or are unfamiliar with. If your project isn't permitted or doesn't comply with the building code, you may have to remove or repair the work at your own expense and be subject to fines by local government.

 Liens being imposed on your property. You may be subject to liens placed on your property by subcontractors or suppliers.
