

#### THANK YOU TO OUR CUSTODIANS:

I want to thank all of our building custodians for the work they perform and their dedication to Sea Towers. Listed below is just some of what your custodian maintains on a daily, weekly, bi-weekly or monthly basis.

EXAMPLE – One custodian, 40-hour workweek. 12 story building

- 12 laundry rooms
- Lint bags or lint water containers to clean
- 2 elevators
- 1 lobby
- 2 trash dumpsters to put out and return 3 times per week
- Washing and disinfecting of 1 garbage room
- Wipe down all doors (inside & out) and door jambs (not unit doors)
- Wipe down pipes in Pump Room and sweep floor
- Sweep or blow debris out of carports
- 12 trash chutes to hose down and spray
- 36 floors of stairwells to sweep and/or mop as necessary
- Wipe down stair handrails
- Lubricate hinges and latches on doors (not unit doors)
- Checking for and replacement of, out of service exit lights, laundry room lights, stairwell lights, and walkway lights
- Cleaning of 2 elevator floors/walls/doors
- Cleaning of fire cabinets and extinguishers
- Mopping of hallways when required
- Vacuuming lobby and hallway rugs
- Removing standing water after rains, in front of elevators and other low spots in hallways
- Cleaning of lobby windows and doors
- Responsible for a set area of the common grounds to maintain on a daily basis (Usually in the morning)

Then throw in putting up and taking down elevator pads and then they start over again the next week, we really do have a great crew



Smoking of any material including, but not limited to, cigarettes, cigars & pipes is not permitted anywhere in the building & within 20 feet of the outside of the building with 2 exceptions: inside condo units, and cigarettes only may be smoked on the  $2^{\rm nd}$  floor outside deck if there is no social event there. Smokers must immediately remove all used smoking materials & are responsible for any damage they cause. Any questions, please contact one of the governors.

To fit inside our elevator cabs with a minimum clearance to prevent any damage, the maximum size of items to be moved inside our elevators is 33"wide X 81" high X 43" deep. All larger items MUST be moved in the stairways.

Because 2 governors are usually gone and there is little governor business during the summer months, there will be no scheduled governor meetings from June through September. Meetings will be called if needed. Our next scheduled meeting will be Thursday, October 24, 2013 at 7:30 PM.






#### Dangers of Hiring an Unlicensed Person

- Poor qualifications. Unlicensed persons typically do not have the education, insurance, or qualification required of a licensee.
- Poor quality work. Unlicensed contractors typically do poor quality work or do not finish the project, leaving the homeowner to spend more money hiring another contractor to repair or finish the project.
- Possible criminal background. Unlicensed persons often have criminal backgrounds that may include fraud, theft, violent crime, sexual offenses, and substance abuse.
- Likelihood of being the victim of a scam. Unlicensed persons often disappear after taking your
  money, leaving you with very few options to help you get your money back or your work completed.
  Scams in the construction industry, especially home improvement, sadly are, widespread. Con artists
  pose as contractors and often target vulnerable people and take advantage of homeowners.
- Limited resources for broken contracts. When you have a dispute with a licensed contractor, you call the Department, which has the authority to discipline and even revoke the license. This gives the licensee more incentive to play fair. However, this type of action is not available against unlicensed contractors and homeowners often find the only answer is an expensive, and generally futile, civil suit.
- No insurance and liability for injuries to others: An unlicensed contractor typically is uninsured
  and will have no way to pay you back for any property damage. You may end up being liable for
  personal or financial injuries to others.
- No coverage under homeowner's policy. Most homeowner policies require that work must be
  done by a licensed contractor and provide no coverage for work that is not.

Noncompliance with building codes. Most projects, even small ones, require permits and inspections that unlicensed contractors ignore or are unfamiliar with. If your project isn't permitted or doesn't comply with the building code, you may have to remove or repair the work at your own expense and be subject to fines by local government.

 Liens being imposed on your property. You may be subject to liens placed on your property by subcontractors or suppliers.

If you did not submit your special entry pass for the new quarter which started April 1st you still have time to submit one. The current quarter special entry passes are good until 6/30/2013.






